

Our generation is experiencing an unprecedented identity crisis. There are widely divergent views about identity and its effects on young people's lifestyles. Historically, family, school, Church, media, and entertainment have significantly shaped the essence of today's generation. These social institutions, particularly the media, accept all post-truth ideologies without proper discernment. Many Christians are suffer-ing from a collective identity crisis due to the demise of a biblical worldview and the breakup of Christcentered families. The social media environment offers the temptation to project an inauthentic self. It is now more intertwined with one's identity, regardless of reality. There is an intense debate about this topic among professors, theologians, psychologists, and politicians. The fluidity of identity is becoming ever more problematic, seeing it as almost infinitely negotiable. The best booksellers, bloggers, and influencers often promote such conflicting lifestyles to the growing generation.

he statement "I am a man trapped in a woman's body" would have been treated as a crude joke or gibberish a couple of decades before. But now, this expression is well respected as it is deemed a meaningful reality for anyone who claims it. The world encounters a new situation that never existed in the academic or non academic realm in the past. The new generation is presented with a set of gender related vocabulary: personal pronouns and new personal identities other than 'man' and 'woman'. The terms 'nonbinary' and 'transgender' are at the top of the list, predicated on another fairly new concept, 'gender fluidity'. As the mind shapers, media, and academia join forces with the government, which ensures legislative endorsement for the new movement, the common people have no choice but to admit the new norms. The Church, which once served as a moral compass of societies in the past, especially in Western societies, is now disengaged from the public arena and relegated to the private affairs of individuals.

The triumph of the 'modern self' emerged from the influence of several significant philosophical worldviews. From Karl Marx, who proposed the conflict between the substructure and superstructure, to Jacques Derrida, who proposed Deconstructionism as the chief reason for this situation. One thing all these world views had in common was a denial of an external, supernatural, metaphysical authority that governs human life and gives more power to the human self. Postmodernity catalysed these philosophical developments and encouraged denying absolute truth and objective moral values, encouraging the new generation to believe the myth that truth is subjective. Therefore, everyone can create their own values, norms and choices. Sadly, a segment of those who profess themselves as Christians have joined the bandwagon and

experimenting with their new reality on the slippery landscape of progressive ideologies.

The progressivists' uncritical application of some of the Christian faith's crucial theological and ethical concepts to accommodate the popular culture is the first step into the slippery ground. According to them, the agape love of God is "all-embracing" regardless of one's choices, even if they seem contrary to the Scripture. Therefore, one's gender identity is not a hindrance to accepting them into the commonwealth of God's love. Even though it may sound very Christian and profoundly ethical, it destroys the foundation of God's moral tenets revealed through the Scripture. For instance, while the notion of gender fluidity is founded on the belief that gender is distinct from sex, where gender is a social construct, and sex is a mere biological marker, on the contrary, the Scripture indicates that the distinction between 'male' and 'female' is a reality of existence endowed with a profound purpose of procreation, filling and stewarding the creation (Gen 1:26-30). Even though the creation account does not address the reality of psychological and biological anomalies, it gives a much greater affirmation that every human is created in the image and likeness of God, which gives enormous room to accept and value those who have physical, mental and emotional differences without undermining the fundamental purpose of the physical distinctive everyone possess.

vangelicals find themselves at a crossroads in the ever evolving landscape of societal norms, wrestling with the tension between adhering to biblical teachings and embracing contemporary ideologies. Romans 12:2 warns Christians against conformity to the patterns of the sinful world, urging believers to stand firm in their faith. Yet, there is a growing trend among some Evangelicals to approve of modern societal shifts, particularly concerning LGBTQ issues, transgender ideology, and the deconstruction of the Christian faith.


The approval of LGBTQ rights and relationships has become a divisive topic within Evangelical circles. The scriptures shaped the historic Christian understanding of marriage and human relationships, emphasizing a heterosexual union. The tension arises as some Evangelicals grapple with reconciling the long standing principles with a call for acceptance and inclusion in the face of evolving societal norms. The key to resolving that tension is acknowledging that the Laws of God do not change with the times. Neither does human biology.

Marriage was not a human idea. God, the Creator of human sexuality and marriage, must have the last word on marriage and morality. God said of man and his wife, 'And they shall become one flesh.' This is a reference to the consummation of marriage through sexual union with the potential to generate new life. The biological definition of sexual organs is not open to debate. There cannot be a sexual union between people of the same sex. Homosexual 'union' is a mere fantasy. Any homosexual 'marriage' will remain an unconsummated farce. "Our critique of Evangelical approval of contemporary trends must be tempered with understanding. Can we remain faithful to God's eternal Word and be compassionate towards lost sinners who are forever opening new battlefronts in their war against God?"

permanent physical changes in minors need to be resisted. Legal frameworks that keep parents out of the loop must be demolished. How can the state claim to be more concerned about children than the parents? What has the state done to help teenagers who regretted their decision to go for life-altering surgeries?

The deconstruction of the Christian faith is a trend that further strains Evangelical unity. As individuals' question and reevaluate their beliefs, some find themselves on a path of deconstruction, challenging long held doctrines and theological frameworks. Although some portray this process as a beneficial exercise, it creates tension within Evangelical communities that have traditionally thrived on doctrinal cohesion.

This is a wake up call for all Christian leaders who promoted anti intellectualism, opposed theological training, and refused to equip their flock against the philosophies of the world. Christians have a right to know why they believe what they believe. Members must be taught to question their faith and to find answers. Doubting Thomases have a place within the Church. If doubt-ers are guided and cared for, they will emerge strong in their faith.



trends, it is crucial to acknowledge the struggles Evangelicals experience. The desire to show love and acceptance while upholding biblical principles creates a tension that demands thoughtful reflection and nuanced discussions. That tension is evident in Jude's command: "Be merciful to those who doubt; save others by snatching them from the fire; to others show mercy, mixed with fear — hating even the clothing stained by cor-rupted flesh" (v. 22-23). Simply dismissing these concerns risks alienating individuals earnestly seeking a faithful path in a rapidly changing world.

In conclusion, the tension within Evangelical communities regarding LGBTQ issues, transgender ideology, and the deconstruction of faith highlights the delicate balance between adhering to biblical teachings and engaging with the evolving world. Romans 12:2 serves as a reminder to resist conformity to worldly patterns, but the challenge lies in discerning where the boundaries between cultural adaptation and scriptural fidelity exist. Navigating this tension requires a commitment to respectful dialogue, understanding, and an appreciation of the complexity inherent in these discussions.

Transgender ideology presents another challenge. Theological perspectives on sexual differentiation are rightly rooted in the binary sexual distinction observed in human biology and attested by biblical teaching. Recent attempts at portraying gender as a spectrum have not succeeded in supplanting this time-tested foundation of human civilization.

Individuals who are confused about their 'gender identity' deserve compassion. Gender dysphoria has to be treated by mental health professionals. Other contributing factors need to be addressed. However, attempts by the state or by individuals to encourage and facilitate The essence of the Romans 12:2 command becomes increasingly relevant in our context. The call to resist conformity to the trends of the world should serve as a guiding principle for Evangelicals navigating these complex issues. However, the challenge lies in defining what constitutes conformity. Cultural adaptation is necessary—but not at the cost of fidelity to scriptural principles.

## SNARE OF Progressive Christianity

he term 'progressive' has a broad range of meanings. As a political philosophy, progressivism seeks to advance the human condition through political reform based on advancements in science, technology, and social organization. When it comes to Christianity, as Michael Kruger rightly said, "It is a master class in half-truths that sounds appealing on the surface until a dig down deeper to really explore their foundations and implications." Progressive Christians deny or downplay the core Christian doctrines like the atonement, biblical authority or inspiration, original sin, the divinity of Jesus, the virgin birth, the physical resurrection of Jesus, the Trinity, and sinlessness of Jesus and affirm non-biblical family relationships and marriages, universal reconciliation, the gospel of social justice and critical theory, pluralism, and pantheism, panentheism or perennialism.

For a progressive Christian, the Scripture is not inspired, authoritative, or inerrant; it is an ancient spiritual travel journal. It merely records what people believed about God in the times and places where they lived. It is also viewed as contradictory and not internally coherent. Suppose the Bible is not authoritative or God breathed. In that case, the claims it proposes are nullified, and anyone can interpret it according to their choice, which is against the traditional Christian view. For a Christian, the Bible is the true Word of God through which God reveals Himself to man, and the children of God are expected to modify their lives according to its teachings.

object of worship. For them, Christianity is not a set of beliefs; they believe that there is no 'orthodoxy'; instead, there is only 'orthopraxy,' the correct way to live our lives. But Christianity is a religion of grace, not a religion of merit. It is not primarily what we do but what God has done in Christ (1 John 4:10). For progressive Christians, Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is horrific or unnecessary. The blood sacrifice of God's Son is perceived as an indictment of God's character, turning the event into a 'cosmic child abuse.' But Jesus' voluntary substitutionary atonement on behalf of humanity to make them righteous with God is an indispensable doctrine of Christianity (1 Pet. 2:24; 3:18). He who knew no sin became sin for us so that in Him, we might become the righteousness of God (2 Cor. 5:21). It reveals God's unfailing love for man. Placing our faith in Christ's work on the cross is what is required of a man to be saved.

The doctrine of the original sin is denied in Progressive Christianity. Instead, it is taught that sin is not what separates us from God but our self-imposed shame. They perceive that we are never separated from God but are loved and accepted by God just as we are. But the Bible clearly teaches that sin separates us from God (Isa. 59:2; Eph. 2:12), and we need a Savior to restore that broken relationship. Though progressive Christian teachings of social justice, care for the poor and the oppressed, and the environmental stewardship of the earth are appealing, it is nothing but Jesus' way of "loving our neighbor as ourselves." It is the result of the outworking of our faith. If we observe keenly, we can understand that progressive Christianity is an assault on the fundamental framework of

# ELDER ABUSE

Ider abuse is an intentional act or failure to act that causes or creates a risk of harm to an older adult. An older adult is someone aged 60 or older. The abuse occurs at the hands of a caregiver or a person the elder trusts 90% of the time, most probably a member of the family. Two-thirds of abusers are adult children or spouses.

#### What are the types of elder abuse?

Common types of elder abuse include physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional or mental abuse, neglect, and financial abuse. Elder abuse is common. Abuse, including neglect and exploitation, is experienced by about 1 in 10 people aged 60 and older who live at home. From 2002 to 2016, more than 643,000 older adults were treated in the emergency department for nonfatal assaults, and over 19,000 homicides occurred. Compared with women, men had higher rates of both nonfatal assaults and homicides.

#### What are the signs of elder abuse?


- Personality changes
- Whimpering, crying, refusing to talk
- Unexplained or repeated bruises, fractures, burns and sores
- Weight loss
- Unkempt appearance
- Poor personal hygiene
- Dirty, disorganised living space
- Confusion, excessive sleeping, signs of inappropriate sedation (too much medicine)

#### What are the consequences?

Elder abuse can have several physical and emotional effects on an older adult. Victims are fearful and anxious. They may have problems with trust and be wary of others. Many victims suffer physical injuries. Some are minor, like cuts, scratches, bruises, and welts. Others are more serious and can cause lasting disabilities. These include head injuries, broken bones, constant physical pain, and soreness. Physical injuries can also lead to premature death and make existing health problems worse.

#### How can we prevent elder abuse?

Several factors may increase or decrease the risk of perpetrating and/or experiencing elder abuse. To prevent elder abuse, we must understand and address the factors that put people at risk or protect them from violence.



- Check-in on older adults who may have few friends and family members.
- Support overburdened caregivers, such as help from friends, family, or local relief care groups; adult day care programs; counselling; and outlets intended to promote emotional wellbeing.
- Encourage and assist persons (either caregivers or older adults) having problems with drug or alcohol abuse in getting help.

Many older adults require care and are vulnerable to violence perpetrated by a caregiver or someone they trust. We need to listen carefully to older people and caregivers. Recognise the signs and raise awareness of elder abuse. Step in and try to intervene if you suspect elder abuse.

## DISCOVER YOUR TRUE IDENTITY IN A CONFUSED CULTURE

Critical theory today is an umbrella term for a cluster of social theories such as postmodernism, critical pedagogy, feminism, black feminism, queer theory, etc. The most common critical theories, such as the social binary, oppression through ideology, lived experience, and social justice, claim that society is divided into dominant and oppressor groups. The primary group includes race, class, gender, sexuality, ability status, religion, and nationality. The specific forms of oppression include sexism, racism, classism, and heterosexism. The minority groups are people of colour (POC), people with low incomes, women, and LGBTQ. The dominant group includes whites, the wealthy, men, and heterosexuals, and they control, oppress, and maintain power by imposing their ideology on everyone (hegemony). Critical theorists now include how the dominant group sets its norms, values, and ideas on society to justify its interests. Critical theory tries to solve social problems and promises to resolve the identity crisis caused by oppression, justice, diversity, and equity. However, such theories are so critical of the existing societal structures and institutions, such as families and churches, and see these institutions as problems rather than agents of solutions. Despite all these efforts, youth are becoming more insecure, rootless, aimless, and desperate to discover who they are.

Societal laws and culture can occasionally marginalize people unintentionally. Where the Bible is silent, we can be flexible about our culture or traditions out of love for those outside our cul-ture. However, many critical theories and programs are not consistent with Christian principles. For example, the terms racism and sexism are considered oppressions right alongside heterosexism or religion. The time has come for honest reviews of these theories from a Christian Biblical perspective. The focus is to provide a balanced biblical response to today's challenging issues affecting our generation in faith, identity,

#### The Knowledge of God Defines Our Identity


### TikTok loses its bid to overturn Gatekeeper status

**B**yteDance's TikTok has lost its bid to suspend its designation as a gatekeeper, which makes it subject to onerous obligations under EU rules after Europe's second top court dismissed its request because it failed to show the urgency for such a move. TikTok took its grievance over the designation to the Luxembourg based General Court in December and asked for an interim measure after being tagged as a gatekeeper under the Digital Markets Act (DMA) in September last year. It said complying with the EU rules would lead to the disclosure of highly strategic information concerning its user profiling practices, which is not public. The Court rejected its request to suspend its designation. "ByteDance has failed to demonstrate the urgency required for an interim order to avoid serious and irreparable damage," judges said. "ByteDance has not shown that there is a real risk of disclosure of confidential information or that such a risk would give rise to serious and irreparable harm," they said.

## Musk moves incorporation of Neuralink to Nevada

A ccording to the business portals of both states, Elon Musk's brain chip implant company, Neuralink, changed its location of incorporation from Delaware to Nevada. The development comes about a week after Musk said Tesla would hold a shareholder vote to transfer its state of incorporation to Texas from Delaware after a judge invalidated his \$56 billion pay package. However, switching Tesla's state of incorporation could come with hurdles, such as investor lawsuits, mainly if it was seen as a move to secure his pay package, legal experts said. Musk said last week that Neuralink had implanted its first brain chip in a human patient recovering well after the procedure.







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## Hyundai Picks JP Morgan and Citi to advance its India IPO

A ccording to sources with direct knowledge, Hyundai Motor has appointed investment bankers JPMorgan and Citi to advise on its at least US\$3 billion India IPO, accelerating listing plans in the world's third largest auto market. The company plans to file regulatory papers in India by May to June for approval, said two of the three sources, all of whom declined to be named as the talks are private. Hyundai, the second biggest automaker in India with a 15 per cent market share, is in the initial stages of considering an IPO in India that would value its local operation at up to US\$30 billion. The IPO could be India's largest. Such a fundraising by Hyundai would put the valuation of its Indian operation at more than half its market capitalization of around US\$47 billion in Seoul. Some domestic Indian investment banks are also likely to be appointed for the IPO in the coming months, the two sources added.

# China pushes pro-Beijing content disguised as news websites.

More than 100 websites disguised as local news outlets in Europe, Asia, and Latin America are pushing pro-China content in a widespread influence campaign linked to a Beijing public relations firm, digital watchdog Citizen Lab has found. Spread over websites in 30 countries, the propaganda material is interspersed with news aggregated from local news outlets and Chinese state media, according to a Toronto-based group research report released on Wednesday (Feb 7). "While the campaign's websites enjoyed negligible exposure to date, there is a heightened risk of inadvertent amplification by the local media and target audiences, as a result of the quick multiplication of these websites and their adaptiveness to local languages and content," researcher Alberto Fittarelli said in the report. The sites' content sways between conspiracy theories, often about the United States or its allies such as a piece blaming American scientists for "leaking" COVID-19 to articles attacking Beijing's critics. It is rare for researchers to link such operations to specific entities. Citizen Lab said the campaign began in mid-2020 and traced the network to public relations firm Shenzhen Haimaiyunxiang Media Co Ltd, also known as Haimai.

### Finnair asks passengers to voluntarily weigh themselves

Imost everything that gets onto a commercial plane **A**fuel, checkedin baggage, cargo and meals is weighed. For passengers and their cabin bags, most airlines use average data. But Finland's national carrier, Finnair said on Friday (Feb 9) that it started asking passengers this week to voluntarily and anonymously hop onto a scale with their hand luggage at the country's main airport in Helsinki, the airline said on Friday. The aim is to get their figures. "We will need data for both the winter season and for the summer season in the winter season, people typically have heavier clothing, which impacts weights," Finnair spokeswoman Päivyt Tallqvist said, adding that the survey would last until May. Passengers boarding onto European and long haul flights won't be "penalized for their weight," and "the numbers are kept discreet, away from prying eyes," she added. So far, about 800 people have joined the survey, and those who agree to participate receive a small gift a reflective baggage tag, Tallqvist said. Tallqvist said airlines can use official European Aviation Safety Authority data or do their standard weight measurements. Finnair has chosen the latter, but safety authorities require that the survey be renewed every five years. The last time Finnair weighed passengers was in 2018. In June, New Zealand's national airline also weighed passengers before boarding. "We hope to have a good sample of volunteers, both business and leisure travellers, also this time, so that we can get the most accurate information possible for important balance calculations," Satu Munnukka, head of ground processes at Finnair, said in a statement

## Expedia share sink after 2024 revenue warning

## Investment banks brace for job cuts as China woes continue

Chares of Expedia plunged 13 per cent in premarket Utrading on Friday (Feb 9) after the online travel firm said it expected 2024 revenue growth rates to be moderate as air fares soften from their post pandemic highs. Late on Thursday, the company said Chief Executive Officer Peter Kern will step down from his position and be replaced by company insider Ariane Gorin. Booking Holdings, Tripadvisor, Trivago, and Airbnb were down between 1 per cent and 4 per cent in premarket trading on amplified concerns about moderating booking and uneven domestic travel demand following a rebound from pandemic lows. On Thursday, Expedia warned that air travel revenue was under pressure due to a fall in average ticket prices. "On a macro level, we expect travel demand to remain relatively healthy, but we expect growth rates across the world to decelerate," outgoing CEO Kern said on the company's earnings call.

Tob cuts at Western investment banks in Asia are expected to increase this year as revenue pressures rise due to deepening economic and market turmoil in China, even as deal prospects brighten in Japan and India, headhunters and bankers said. They added that a new round of staff cuts that began in late 2023 on the Chinese mainland and Hong Kong, critical regional investment banking hubs, will gather pace in the coming months. US boutique bank Lazard announced internally last month it would close its Beijing office, resulting in some employees being laid off while others were to be relocated to Hong Kong, two people with knowledge of the move said. Its European peer Rothschild disbanded its Shanghai based team in the fourth quarter, two separate people with knowledge of the matter said. Last month, Bank of America announced job cuts for more than 20 Asian bankers. China's stock markets, hovering around five year lows, and the country's weaker than expected recovery from the pandemic have deepened investor worries and soured companies' domestic demand outlook. Geopolitical tensions have also driven foreign investors away. "If the deal flow continues the way it has been in 2023, the market could expect some more cuts," said Sid Sibal, vice president of Greater China and head of Hong Kong at recruitment firm Hudson.







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

I ndia's interior minister said on Thursday (Feb 8) that he had "recommended the immediate suspension" of a free movement border agreement with Myanmar, from where thousands have fled since fighting between the junta and its opponents surged last year. Amit Shah said the foreign ministry was already "in the process of scrapping" the deal, which allows those living in border zones to venture a short distance into their neighbouring nation's territory without a visa. Many in the border zones share close cultural and religious ties. Shah said it was necessary "to ensure the country's internal security and maintain the demographic structure" of regions bordering Myanmar. That includes India's restive Manipur state, where more than 200 people have been killed since clashes broke out last May between the predominantly Hindu Meitei majority and mainly Christian Kuki community. Many of those who have fled to India from Myanmar share ethnic ties with the Kukis. Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh, from the ruling Hindu-nationalist Bharatiya

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
